This reminded me of another tidbit I had read months earlier. I looked through my notes and found information regarding a young member from the Twin Cities Model A Club named Sam Nelson. Sam presented a clinic on the Hubley models, explaining the various models, many of which are Ford products. Sam showed models that he raced at National Model A Meets. What a great way to include youth to participate in their chapters by having the youth teaching the youth. This same article mentioned the Henry Ford Trade School at the Highland Park Plant. Young students attend classes in the morning and work in the plant during the afternoon. If you know of a young member who would like to pursue a technical curriculum in school, this would be wonderful place to consider.
