## **Footwear for the Winter** By Patti Jones (From Oct. 1928 Delineator)

France dictated women's dress styles, as well as footwear to wear with them. These styles were shown to be worn with the new Winter styles in 1928. Slipper styles as well as straps in various widths were used. Colors and fabrics ran the gamut. I found these to be quite fancy but in the article it stated shoes should be simple and not a noticeable item with the dress. The following are the most unusual ones shown in the article. Please note that shoe (L) shows a button and not a buckle on the strap. The button shoe was used through about 1929, and thereafter only buckles were used. That is a good way of helping date any footwear you find. Remember...if the shoe fits, buy it; especially if you have a shoe size of 7 ½ and larger!! If you don't have an era dress...you have more of a chance finding a dress to match the shoes than finding shoes to match the dress.

- A. Twisted strap slipper in dark blue satin with gold piping and embroidery.
- B. Evening slipper with a line of silver and iridescent pink kid.
- C. Low heel mule (lounging slipper) in gray antelope and lined in satin.
- D. Satin slipper of green and white with an emerald and diamond ornament.
- E. Buckle slipper in gold lizard with topaz stones on ornament.
- F. Polka-dot slipper for afternoon in tones of beige and mauve dots.
- G. Modernistic shoe encrusted with silver and patent gun metal leather.
- H. Crepe de Chine in pale green with silver kid leather lines
- K. Saddle strap shoe for a sporty look in dark brown kid.
- L. Button strapped shoe in beige and brown kid with woven beading for sport.
- N. Evening pump in a rosy-beige satin and gold kid with a cut-out design around the front.
- O. High-cut slipper of black patent kid and black lizard.
- P. Pump with triangles of gold and silver kid on black patent leather.
- Q. Sandal of vermilion crepe de Chine with bands of silver kid for trim.
- R. Mule (lounging slipper) of gilded wood with the silver ids straps encrusted with gold triangles.
