

Clearing Computer Cache Memory

Macintosh – Safari

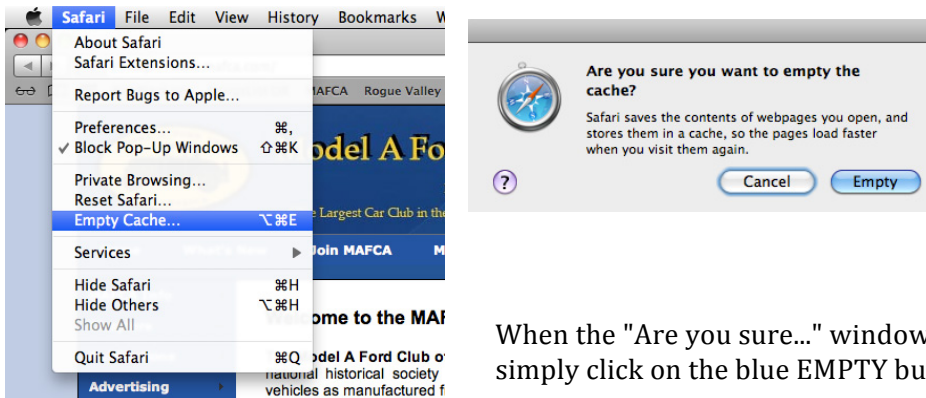
If your computer isn't showing you the current information on a web page, that might be caused by your computer displaying the web page out of "cache memory" on your computer instead of downloading the current page. There are several things you can do to try to force the computer to go to the web page instead of getting the page out of the cache.

Safari 5 - Macintosh



The easiest thing to try first is to click on the Reload/Refresh button at the far right side of the address bar. In the screen shot below, note where the red arrow is pointing. That tells Safari to reload the page from the website.

If that doesn't work, then the next thing I do is to click on SAFARI menu and then EMPTY CACHE. Notice you can use a keyboard shortcut – Option-Command-E.



When the "Are you sure..." window opens, simply click on the blue EMPTY button.

Once that's done, you'll be back at your browser page. At this time, click on the Refresh/Reload button and you should get the new page from the website.
